## An Update on the November Election



After the November election results, a new mayor was named and two incumbent commissioners were elected to serve another four-year term. Then-Commissioner Lew Weatherspoon unseated incumbent Mayor R.H. Ellington by a three-vote margin. The Mayor-elect, accompanied by his wife, Peggy, was administered the oath of office by the Honorable District Court Judge Caron Stewart, featured at top, far left. Mayor Pro Tem/Commissioner Bob Smith, top right, and bottom left, incumbent Commissioner Craig Honeycutt — assisted by his daughter, Savannah — were sworn in for another term. At left, former Mayor R.H. Ellington — shown with his wife, Jeanne — was honored with a Key to the Town, and will have the Town's Depot Square renamed in his honor — Ellington Square.
