Code of Ethics

The Code of Ethics has been developed to protect and promote the best interests of Angier Youth Sports, its coaches, its participants and the parents of those participants. The primary purpose is to distinguish ethical and approved professional practices. Its purpose is to emphasize the value of youth sports and to stress proper functions of coaches in their relationship with other coaches, the players, officials, and the parents of the participants.

The welfare of Angier Youth Sports depends on how coaches live up to the spirit and letter of ethical conduct. Coaches unwilling or unable to comply with the principles of the Code of Ethics have no place volunteer coaching.

The Code should be studied regularly by all coaches and its principals should always be followed. Violation of the Code should be reported to the Recreational Staff for the Town of Angier.

The coach should never place the value of winning above that of instilling the highest desirable ideals and character traits in his players. The safety and welfare of his players should always be uppermost in the mind of the coach, and they must never be sacrificed for any personal prestige or glory.

Both the letter and spirit of the rules must be adhered to by the coaches.

A coach should not make demands on his players that will interfere with the player's opportunities for achieving academic success. The function of the coach is to educate students through participation of sports. The primary and basic function should never be disregarded.

Coaches should promote good sportsmanship. Any coach who permits or encourages the use of unsportsmanlike tactics, including the disparagement of fellow coaches, shall be considered guilty of the most serious breach of coaching ethics.

For a coach to address, or permit anyone on his bench to address uncomplimentary remarks to any official during the program of a games, or to indulge in conduct with might incite players or spectators against game officials is a violation of the rules of the game and must likewise be considered conduct unworthy of a member of the coaching profession.

Coaches must provide a sports environment that is free of drugs, tobacco, and alcohol.

A coach's actions and behavior should at all times bring credit to himself, his/her team, and the Town of Angier.
